

Into All the World

Introduction

Most stories end when the hero dies leaving this world behind to the care of others, but the Nazarene's story is different—his merely begins where all others end. Luke both begins and ends his second volume in a most peculiar way. He begins Jesus' story as he ascends into heaven where all good tales end but not this one for the story of Jesus continues in the lives of his disciples. He concludes his story with Paul still under house arrest with no mention of how his trial turns out. What is the reason for such a strange ending? Look at the last line: "*He lived there two whole years at his own expense, and welcomed all who came to him, proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance*" (Acts 28:30-31). Paul's fate is unimportant. Luke's story is about the spread of the gospel, how it changed so many and how it continues spreading no matter who tries to prevent it.

As in any good story, we become caught up in its characters, however the principle characters are not Peter or Paul but Jesus and his church as God works among his people through the pouring out of his Spirit. As Paul puts it, "*What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth*" (1 Corinthians 3:5-7). We appreciate the contribution of Paul and others who brought the gospel to us, but their work is in vain if God's word does not live in us. In a sense, we are the continuation of the story of Acts as God works in us shaping more in his likeness as individuals and as a body of believers.

Beginning Your Study

A good study Bible such as the **NIV Study Bible** ought to be sufficient for most of your needs. Make sure your Bible has a concordance (for finding passages containing a certain word), a glossary or dictionary (for looking up the meaning of Bible words) and an atlas (for locating places). **Holman Illustrated Bible Dictionary** is a good entry-level resource for all ages. **Chronological and Background Charts of the New Testament** by H. Wayne House provides a vast array of helpful materials in quick reference chart form. Two handouts are available for any interested as a further help for Bible study—*Knowledge Base* and *A Chronology of Acts*.
